<b>1. <b>3. Maintain high professional standards</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Uphold the values, standards, and positive reputation of the College and as set out in the Teaching Council Standards</li><li>• Keep up to date with curriculum development and effective teaching and learning practices.</li><li>• Participate in and contribute to meetings with other staff, parents and other organisations as required.</li><li>• Participate in the school's professional learning programme and the school's professional growth cycle.</li></ul>
