
FROM THE EDUCATIONAL SCHOOL LEADER

2017 Preliminary NCEA Results

While we still await for confirmation of the final NCEA results from NZQA, I am pleased to provide the preliminary results that highlights our continued outstanding consistent success as in other years.

Level 1 (Year 11)	95.6%
Level 2 (Year 12)	97.9%
Level 3 (Year 13)	93.5%

These results reflect the conscientious effort our students make, supported by the excellent work of staff and parents.

Scholarship Results

There were 11 scholarships and we acknowledge the outstanding efforts of Kelly Feng (Dux 2017) on achieving scholarship in five subjects (English, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Calculus). This entitles Kelly to receive a Scholarship Award making her eligible to receive \$2,000 each year for up to three years for as long as she maintains at least a 'B' grade average each year of her tertiary study. Elizabeth Leaning is acknowledged for receiving an Outstanding Scholarship for English.

The day before Waitangi Day, SMC hosted 300 teaching and administrative staff, Ministry of Education staff and other invited guests to attend the inaugural gathering of SMC, Elim Christian College, Our Lady Star of the Sea, St Mark's Pakuranga and KingsGate School in Pukekohe that make up the South Eastern Kāhui Ako.



Our Kapa Haka Group performed a Powhiri welcome and each school candle was lit, bringing presence to our work for the day followed by a short liturgy. The purpose of the day (Investing in Educational Success) was explained and each Principal shared key work that has been going on behind the scenes for the past 18 months. These included: The place of our special character and faith going forward, values and vision; data and inquiry; building a relationship with each school; Board of Trustees involvement; the appointment process of the Kāhui Ako Leaders (within and across schools).

Dr Howard Youngs (AUT) addressed the audience on managing change and working in a collaborative space, while Dr Brian Annan (Infinity Learning) spoke of his role as the Expert Partner assisting the Kāhui Ako with their achievement challenges.

It was a highly successful day and an important one for us as we move forward developing our relationship with each other and ensuring there is a shared understanding of the work and commitment required of everyone in this collaborative space.
