A New Face on the Old: Improving Our Digital Communication

Parental participation can be seen as a continuum from involvement to engagement to empowerment and can influence a child's motivation and their enthusiasm to learn. We are wanting to increase parental engagement



in what future learning looks like. Students are using a variety of learning processes, competencies and language compared with rote learning which previous generations demonstrated and is not for everybody. WHAT TO DO IF YOUR CHILD IS SICK AT SCHOOL

Please can we ask for your support in reminding your child(ren) about the following procedures, so that very busy parents / caregivers are not summoned unnecessarily to the College?

- If a student feels unwell at school, they should tell their teacher and then visit our sickbay to see our qualified school nurse
- The school nurse will see them and as our medical professional, she will make a decision as to whether we need to notify a parent / caregiver. We appreciate that you are busy people and we do not request that you come to school at short notice unless absolutely necessary.
- As students are in our care during the day at school, we notify parents / caregivers about such matters.
- Students are NOT permitted to call/text/email you to come and get them. For the past week through daily notices and a verbal reminder as part of this week's full school assembly, we have been reminding the students of the mentioned procedures.

The survey is part of an international effort by Pope Francis to better understand the lives, attitudes and concerns of young people around the world, in the lead up to the Synod on "Young people, faith and vocational discernment" in Rome, October 2018.

New Zealanders aged 16 - 29 years old are encouraged to answer the survey and tell their friends about it and share the link with their networks. The survey will go live on 23 July and will run for five weeks, with the closing date for responses midnight on Sunday, 27 August 2017.
