What is NCEA?

In 2025, Year 11, 12 and 13 students will be working towards the qualification called NCEA, which stands for National Certificate of Educational Achievement.

There will be three levels:

Level 1 NCEA Level 2 NCEA Level 3 NCEA

All students will enter for the NCEA qualification in those subjects where they have followed an NCEA course throughout the year.

Gaining NCEA

NCEA Level One	60 credits at any Level (1, 2 or 3) + 10 Literacy and 10 Numeracy credits
NCEA Level Two	60 credits at Level 2 or above + 10 Literacy credits and 10 Numeracy credits.
NCEA Level Three	60 credits at Level 3 or above + 10 Literacy credits and 10 Numeracy credits.

Literacy and numeracy in the NCEA journey


Students need to show that they have foundational reading, writing and numeracy skills to gain an NCEA qualification. This is also known as the NCEA Co-requisite.

While students can still progress through their NCEA journey, they must achieve the literacy and numeracy co-requisite to gain NCEA.

Students can achieve the requirements any time throughout their NCEA journey.

Students can try to achieve the requirements many times throughout their NCEA journey.

Students need to meet literacy and numeracy requirements once only.



During the transitional period, 2024-2025, the NCEA Literacy and Numeracy Co-requisite can be achieved by:

COMMON ASSESSMENT ACTIVITIES (CAAs)

- Teachers will organise these online assessments for students.
- Students can sit these reading, writing and numeracy assessments in any year from Year 9 onwards, at a time when they are ready.



ACHIEVING 10 LITERACY CREDITS AND 10 NUMERACY CREDITS FROM A LIST OF APPROVED STANDARDS.

 Talk to your school about what choices of literacy and numeracy standards are available.

- > Credits achieved towards the co-requisite cannot be used to count toward another subject area.
- > From 2026, the Common Assessment Activities will be the only English-medium co-requisite option.

Endorsement of National Certificates in Educational Achievement (NCEA)

50 credits at Excellence to gain an NCEA endorsed with Excellence 50 credits at Merit (or Merit and Excellence), to gain an NCEA endorsed with Merit.

Course Endorsement Certificates in Educational Achievement (NCEA)

For a Course Endorsement a student will need to achieve at least 14 credits at Merit or Excellence in a particular subject (regarded as a course by NZQA) and at a specific level. Credits will be needed from both internal and external assessments (minimum of 3 credits from both internal and external assessments)

DANCE - LEVEL 1

Dance Aotearoa Semester 1

Te toi whakairo, ka ihiihi, ka wehiwehi, ka aweawe te ao katoa

Artistic excellence makes the world sit up in wonder.

In Dance, the Learning Area whakataukī is about an exchange of energy — this involves ihi, wehi, and wana. Ihi is shared by radiating energy during choreography, rehearsals, and performance. This energy causes observers to experience wehi when they feel an emotional response to the ihi. Wana is created when these two energies connect, inspiring a sense of awe.

Dance is shaped by culture and represents culture. Akonga can express and share their culture through movement. Dance is a way to access and benefit from mātauranga Māori and te ao Māori, and Pacific knowledges, worldviews, and values. Through Dance, ākonga can connect with and appreciate different ideas and beliefs and build connections across cultures.






