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What is NCEA?

In 2026, Year 11, 12 and 13 students will be working towards the qualification called NCEA, which stands for National Certificate of Educational Achievement.

There will be three levels:

Level 1 NCEA

Level 2 NCEA

Level 3 NCEA

All students will enter for the NCEA qualification in those subjects where they have followed an NCEA course throughout the year.

Gaining NCEA

NCEA Level One	60 credits at any Level (1, 2 or 3) + 10 Literacy and 10 Numeracy credits
NCEA Level Two	60 credits at Level 2 or above + 10 Literacy credits and 10 Numeracy credits.
NCEA Level Three	60 credits at Level 3 or above + 10 Literacy credits and 10 Numeracy credits.

Literacy and numeracy in the NCEA journey


Students need to show that they have foundational reading, writing and numeracy skills to gain an NCEA qualification. This is also known as the NCEA Co-requisite.

While students can still progress through their NCEA journey, they must achieve the literacy and numeracy co-requisite to gain NCEA.

Students can achieve the requirements **any time** throughout their NCEA journey.

Students can try to achieve the requirements **many times** throughout their NCEA journey.

Students need to meet literacy and numeracy requirements **once only**.



COMMON ASSESSMENT ACTIVITIES (CAAs)

- › Teachers will organise these online assessments for students.
- › Students can sit these reading, writing and numeracy assessments in any year from Year 9 onwards, at a time when they are ready.

Or

ACHIEVING 10 LITERACY CREDITS AND 10 NUMERACY CREDITS FROM A LIST OF APPROVED STANDARDS.

Endorsement of National Certificates in Educational Achievement (NCEA)

50 credits at Excellence to gain an NCEA endorsed with Excellence

50 credits at Merit (or Merit and Excellence), to gain an NCEA endorsed with Merit.

Course Endorsement Certificates in Educational Achievement (NCEA)

For a Course Endorsement a student will need to achieve at least 14 credits at Merit or Excellence in a particular subject (regarded as a course by NZQA) and at a specific level. Credits will be needed from both internal and external assessments (minimum of 3 credits from both internal and external assessments)

ON-LINE LEARNING ENHANCEMENT PLATFORMS

Education Perfect :

Year 11 students

Your child will be able to access Education Perfect online learning as a trial until the end of March. This digital platform supports their learning and has many benefits:

- Students can access the resource from home
- Teachers can set regular homework which can be accessed from home or school and be monitored by caregivers
- Facilitates teachers being able to individualise learning programmes
- Consolidate and reinforce concepts covered in class
- Will develop student agency about managing schoolwork

They will have a license to access curriculum subjects including Maths, Science, and English.

This is highly recommended as a valuable educational enhancement platform. Teachers can use this to set personalised tasks for students that can accelerate and extend their learning at the appropriate level. This \$70 license will be loaded onto your account unless notified otherwise.

Turnitin :

Year 9-13 students:

Over 85% of our students will go on to university or tertiary study from Sancta Maria College. To ensure the best preparation for their academic writing the college will be using for Years 9-13 students an academic tool called Turnitin.

Sancta Maria College Year 9-13 students will have full access to the Turnitin Assignment tool for every assessment submission. Turnitin is a 'text-matching' software which is designed to educate students regarding appropriate citation and referencing techniques. Turnitin is also used to provide our College with confidence in the academic integrity of student work. Turnitin does this by comparing a student submission against an archive of Internet documents, Internet data, a repository of previously submitted papers, and subscription repository of periodicals, journals, and publications. Turnitin then creates an 'Originality Report' which can be viewed by both teachers and students, which identifies where the text within a student submission has matched another source.

It is important to note that Turnitin does not detect plagiarism. Turnitin will only match the text within a student's assignment to text located elsewhere (e.g. found on the Internet, within journals or on databases of student papers). Correct interpretation of these results by both teachers and students is essential for the successful use of Turnitin.

It also protects our students' original work from being used without citation by another person and serves as a learning tool to help instructors and students better identify and correct unintentional plagiarism.

These skills are necessary at university and Turnitin is used at both Auckland University and AUT for all their student assessment submissions. This \$16 license will be loaded onto your account unless we are notified otherwise.

Interfaith Dialogue in a Pluralistic Society Semester 2

Have you attended a school mass and wondered what was going on? Have you ever wondered what goes on at the Buddhist temple across the road from Sancta Maria College?



Being part of the Catholic community means being part of culture that has features that are intriguing but can also be bewildering. Living in Aotearoa New Zealand means living alongside people who may be of a different religious tradition.

This module encourages students to explore a variety of processes, materials, and techniques in response to a personal art-making intention. Through photography and digital manipulations, students will develop and refine their digital skills while responding to their own ideas and themes. The focus is on deepening their understanding of visual art conventions and how these can be applied effectively.



Students will investigate the principles and applications of different media, supported by conceptual knowledge and critical thinking. Students will work across a range of techniques including photography, drawing and digital processes using software Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator to produce a cohesive body of work.

Possible outcomes could include but not limited to:

- Digital painting
- Digital collage
- Photography

ART- LEVEL 1 (11ART2P)

My Kainga Wāewae | Practical Art | Semester 2

In this module, students will make a sculpture based on the concept of 'home', interpreting it through a personal lens. They will design and construct a three-dimensional sculpture using materials such as cardboard, papier-mâché, clay, paper, and paint. Students can choose whether their outcome is painting only or if they want to develop their ideas through a sculptural exploration.



Through this process, students will build their understanding of sculptural conventions and explore how meaning can be communicated through paint, form, material, and space.

Students will document their creative process, install their final piece and photograph the outcome. Emphasis is placed on developing practical skills in response to individual ideas and themes, while deepening their understanding of visual art conventions. They will explore the principles and applications of a range of media, supported by conceptual content and critical reflection.

Possible outcomes could include but not limited to:

- Painting
- Sculpture

My Kainga Wāewae | Digital Art | Semester 2

In this module, students will make an outcome based on the concept of 'home', interpreting it through a personal lens. They will design and produce digital outcomes which will be displayed and made into a 3D house shape. Students can choose whether their outcome is digitally illustrated, photography based or digitally manipulated using their own photography.

Through this process, students will build their understanding of digital conventions and explore how meaning can be communicated through line, space, form and composition. Students will be using Adobe Photoshop or Illustrator to and will document their creative process, install their final piece and photograph the outcome. Emphasis is placed on developing digital skills in response to individual ideas and themes, while deepening their understanding of visual art conventions. They will explore the principles and applications of digital art, supported by conceptual content and critical reflection.



Possible outcomes could include but not limited to:

- Digital painting
- Digital collage
- Photography



Artistic excellence makes the world sit up in wonder.

Drama celebrates and explores the concept of whakapapa. It is a carrier of traditions, cultures, and ideas that can be preserved within texts and then expressed by creators and performers through their own experiences.



By providing windows into the past, drama helps us to prepare for the future by challenging us to reflect on the attitudes and beliefs of characters within local, regional, national, and global contexts.

Ākonga will understand that the function of drama is to heal, educate, entertain, or transform society. They discover how theatre can either challenge the status quo or reinforce it, gaining an awareness of how impactful the medium can be.







Students will investigate how human-induced changes contribute to environmental issues such as acid rain, climate change, pollution, and soil degradation. The course will examine the release of greenhouse gases during combustion and the effects of mining on the environment. Students will gain a deep understanding of how chemical processes are linked to environmental challenges, and how science can inform solutions to mitigate human impact on the planet.



We will explore fundamental physical phenomena related to mechanics, combining theoretical concepts with hands-on investigations. Students will study the principles of motion, forces, energy, and momentum, and how these concepts apply to real-world situations. The course will emphasize the scientific method, guiding students through experiments and problem-solving activities that illustrate key mechanical principles. This module will include a number of practical activities.

SCIENCE - LEVEL 1 (11SCI2D)

Biology of DNA – The Blueprint of Life Semester 2

Have you ever wondered what makes your physical characteristics similar yet different from your parents or other family members? This course investigates the principles and



mechanisms underlying genetic variation, the foundation of biological diversity. Students will explore how genetic differences arise through mutations, gene flow, recombination, and other processes, and how these variations influence traits, evolution, and species adaptation.

The course will also cover the role of genetic variation in health and disease, examining how genetic diversity affects susceptibility to illnesses and responses to treatments. Students will gain a deep understanding of how genetic variation shapes the living world and its implications for fields such as medicine, agriculture, and conservation.

Biology of Microorganisms – Friend or Foe? Semester 2

Are bacteria, fungus and viruses a friend or foe? This course investigates the dual nature of microorganisms, examining how these tiny organisms can be both essential allies and dangerous adversaries. Students will explore the beneficial roles microorganisms play in health, industry, and the environment, such as in digestion, fermentation, and nutrient cycling.

Conversely, the course will also cover the harmful aspects, including pathogenic bacteria, viruses, and fungi that cause diseases in humans, animals, and plants. Students will gain a balanced perspective on the complex playss microorganisms play in our world, enabling them to assess their impact on global health and ecosystems.


